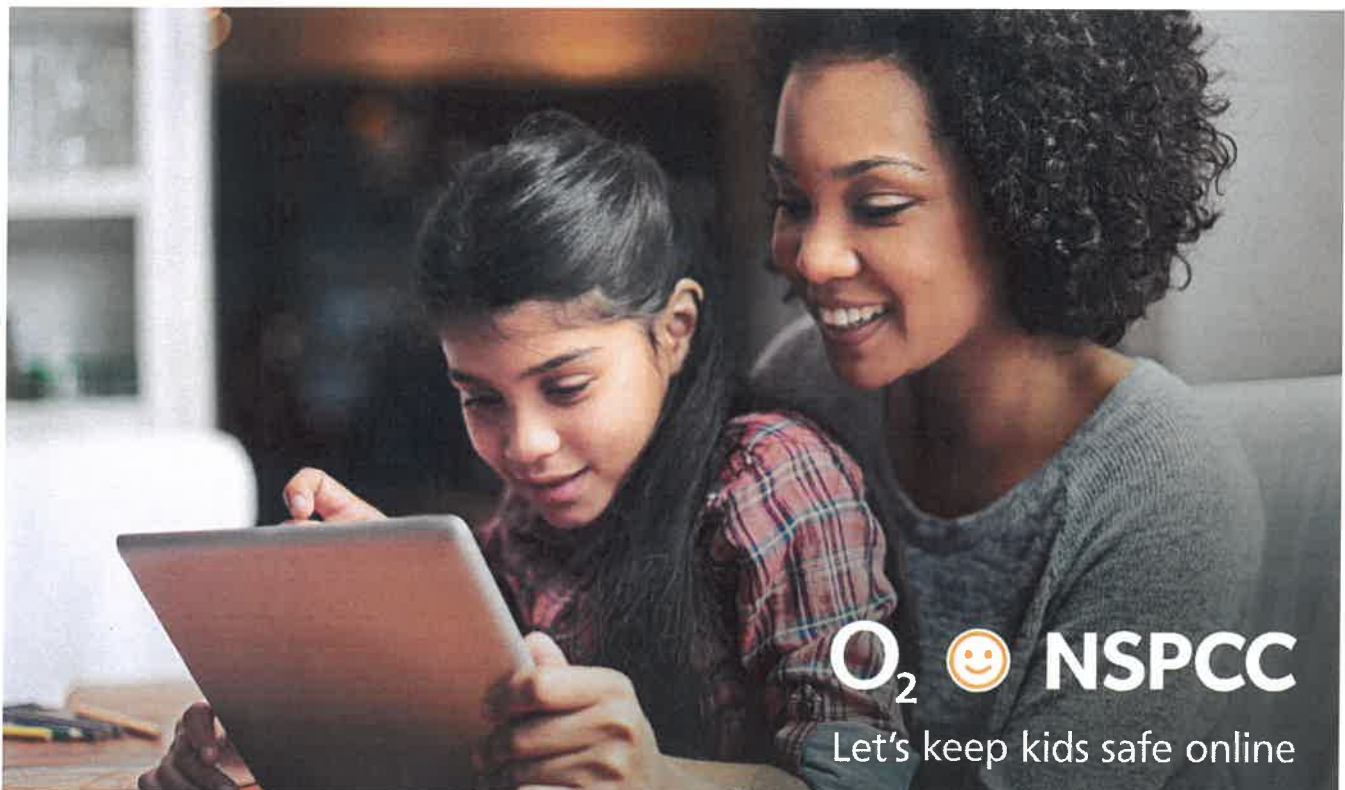

Will you join us and help keep all children safe online?

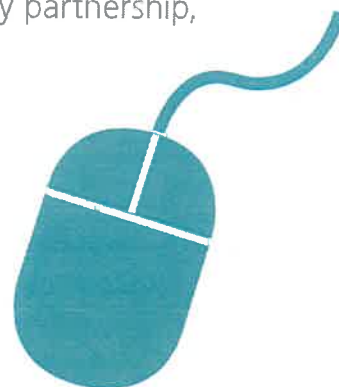
