(Please keep this leaflet for future reference)

WHAT IS THE CENTRE FOR?

- **A place where the community can gather to receive information, advice and support during local incidents e.g. a major flood or prolonged utility failure etc.**
- **A reception centre for any people displaced by emergencies**
- **A base for agencies and other support groups to base themselves.**
- **A place to get advice, warmth and have a cup of tea**

WHAT TO DO IF YOU NEED TO USE THE CENTRE

- **IF THERE IS AN EMERGENCY SITUATION LOCALLY AND YOU WANT TO ACCESS THE CENTRE, FIRST CHECK IT IS OPEN**
- **YOU CAN DO THIS BY CONTACTING THE LOCAL COUNCIL VIA THEIR 24-HOUR CONTACT CENTRE ON 01524 67099 OR CHECK OUR FACEBOOK PAGE @tSLCEC**
- **IF THE CENTRE IS OPEN, MAKE YOUR WAY TO ST.PAUL'S PARISH HALL, SCOTFORTH, LANCASTER, LA1 4ST**
- **TRY TO LET FRIENDS AND FAMILY KNOW OF YOUR WHEREABOUTS**

Remember, if there is an emergency, the emergency services should always be first to respond. The centre is not a substitute for them and if you require assistance, please contact them by dialing 999.
