#### **Are you interested in helping set up an Emergency Centre in South Lancaster?**

Flooding in November brought home the potential impacts of extreme weather events. Out of the earlier experience of flooding and power outage in Lancaster in 2015, a Lancaster Resilience Commission was established. This has led to several localities in and around Lancaster setting up a Community Emergency Group who have identified a suitable local building to act as an Emergency Centre, set up a simple communication system and collected basic resources. Such an Emergency Centre would act as a hub for ordinary people as distinct from the work of the Emergency Services - it would be a place where people can gather together, communicate, work together to solve problems as well as offer and receive support. 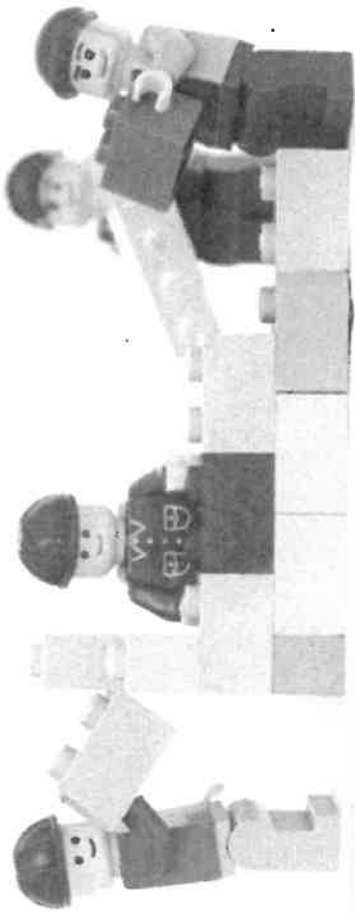
