### Coconut Allergy

### P.E. Kits

Children should have a P.E. kit in school **everyday**. If they take the kit home to be washed, please ensure they bring it back the next day, otherwise they will not be able to take part in class P.E. lessons.

### Dinner Money

Dinner money for a child who has a school dinner every day is £48.30 until half-term and £128.80 until the end of term. Please ensure **all school meals are paid in advance**. Any parent who has a debt of £23.00 or above will be asked to provide a packed lunch for their child until the debt is cleared. Statements are sent out to parents if they are about to reach this amount. If any parent is finding it difficult to pay for school meals, please come into school and discuss it rather than let the debt escalate.

### Money

Would parents please ensure that any money brought to school to pay for trips, meals, etc. is in a sealed envelope with their child's name clearly marked on the front. Many thanks.

### School Uniform

Would all parents ensure that every item of school uniform is **CLEARLY NAMED**. Any un-named clothing that is found in school will be kept in Lost Property for a maximum of 2 weeks and then disposed of. We are sure you can appreciate that trying to match up a green un-named sweatshirt with a child is almost impossible when all the children wear green!

### Morning Tuck Shop

Following discussions with School Council we have decided that in order to try and reduce the amount of single use plastic we use, and help our teeth, we will no longer serve pure fruit juice cartons at the healthy tuck shop at morning break. The children were informed of this before the holidays and this takes effect from Monday 29th April. We will continue to sell brown toast, and of course water is freely available all day from our water coolers. Please do ensure your child has a named reusable water bottle in school.
