Friday 14th February: Start of the sponsored reading challenge which will take place for 3 weeks. All the children have been given a letter and sponsor form (please ask and check bags but a copy is attached if it has been lost!).

Tuesday 3rd Dress Up Day: feel free to come dressed as a book character. No fancy/expensive costumes are necessary, but please bring the book you are linked to (footballers are fine if you bring along a football related book. Other easy ideas are characters from the Midnight Gang—pyjamas, or Alex Rider—teenage spy..). This is also the day we are having our Harry Potter themed lunch.

We will have loads of other reading related activities in school that week including creating book displays shared reading with other classes, a quiz, picture trails, etc.

The money raised is being split with half going to St John's Hospice and the other half being distributed between the classes to develop their reading corners, so the more we read, the more we raise!

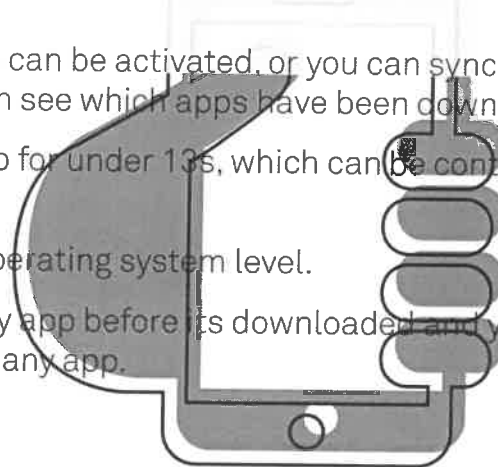

SOME PARENTS OR GUARDIANS FIND OUT TOO LATE THAT YOUNG PEOPLE HAVE BEEN ACCESSING INAPPROPRIATE PLATFORMS OR CONTENT.

Some devices have built-in controls which can be activated, or you can sync your child's phone to your phone so that you can see which apps have been downloaded;

- Google Family Link is a free android app for under 13s, which can be controlled by the parent's iPhone or Android phone.
- iPhone's iOS 12 offers controls at the operating system level.
- Net-aware.org.uk lets you check out any app before its downloaded and you can see independent reviews of the risks of any app.



Other options include:

	Qustodio	Free or £	Free version or premium plans available from £36 p.a. but no monthly payment option available. Daily reports about phone and laptop use, consoles not covered. Location tracker included. Blocker for certain apps. Requires setting up on each device separately. Good reviews on comparison sites.
	Net Nanny	££	Includes internet filter, scheduled access, activity alerts and reports but does not cover apps. Requires setting up on each device separately
	OurPact	££	Tracks calls, texts, social media use. High degree of parental control, including scheduling access to certain apps at certain times of day. Requires setting up on each device separately. Doesn't cover consoles or laptops.
	Kaspersky Safe Kids	Free or £	Web monitoring, time limits, app management. Laptops also covered but not consoles. Good value option.
	Norton Family Premier	££	Web filters, location tracking, time scheduling and monitoring for unlimited android and Windows devices.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

To celebrate World Book Day here at Scotforth we are running a **sponsored read** between **Friday 14th February and Friday 6th March** (the end of World Book Day week). We'd love your child to join in. The money that we raise will be split two ways: half towards St John's Hospice (our charity this year) and half towards our reading books in school.

Pupils can choose whatever they want to read - from comics to classics and audio books to blogs. They are not being assessed: it's all about reading for fun. Hopefully they will be motivated to read because the money they raise in sponsorship helps to provide new books for school and also support a really worthwhile charity.

All you have to do is:

1. **Take a look at what they plan to read**, or help them complete their reading challenge (which ideally would have them read more than they would normally).

Each child can set their own challenge which could be linked to a list of books they would like to read, the number of books they want to read, how many minutes they want to read for each day, or how many pages they want to read a day. Remember they can read whatever they want: books, e-books, poetry, comics – anything goes! Sharing books is fine too (in fact recommended!) as well as listening to audio books. The key thing is that each child enjoys reading and sharing stories/books.

2. **Help your child find sponsors among family and friends.** This can be as many or as few people as you are able. Please do not let it become a burden! Every little bit helps.
3. **Help your children return the money to school by Friday 13th March.**

As well as the Sponsored Read we will be celebrating reading across the whole week of World Book Day at Scotforth. Some of the events will include:

Dress up as a book character on Tuesday 3rd March (not the traditional Thursday as one class has a trip that day). Please do not feel you need a fancy/expensive costume for this!

Reading assembly/whole school quiz,

World Book Day lunch (Tuesday 3rd March)

Reading character trail

Reading with buddies/other classes

Ring-a-read

We would also love you to come in and share a book in your child's class during that week (more details to follow).

World Book Day is celebrated in many primary schools in Lancashire.
