# Friends of Dorrington Woods and Play Park

## Minutes of meeting on Tuesday 4 September 2018

Present: Sharon McCulloch, Hilary Smith, Gill Melling

Apologies: Sue and Gary Bradshaw, Pauline Burgmans, Gillian Sheath, Abi Mills

1. Kevin and Neil from Lancaster City Council came to walk round the woods with Hilary and Abi on 23 August to assess the state of the steps and trees that are reaching the end of their lives/have overhanging branches. They agreed to repair the broken steps if we supply the cement, which we can do because we will be ordering it for the path repairs anyway. No firm commitment on the trees but at least Neil acknowledged that several do need attention.
2. The council came on 3<sup>rd</sup> September to clear rubbish and rubble from the bottom of the slope by the allotments.
3. We've been requested to add a handrail to the steep part of the path that runs down the side of the play park. We'll see if we can do this while we are boarding the paths on 30<sup>th</sup> Sept.
4. We are in the process of applying for a small grant from Lancaster Community Fund, to buy bird and bat boxes, nails, gloves, and a first aid kit. We will keep you posted.
5. Dog poo continues to be a problem, and the laminated dog poo signs keep being ripped off. It has been reported to the council. When we get the noticeboards put in, this will include 4 sturdy A4 dog poo signs that should be durable. In the meantime, if someone has bright spray paint, we can mark the poo to draw attention to it.
6. Hilary is ordering materials and securing tools for boarding the paths and installing noticeboards on 30<sup>th</sup> September, and is liaising with Yorkshire Building Society staff re their involvement. Materials will be delivered on the Sat if possible, or Friday (TBC when order is placed). Sharon will be around to check/sign for the delivery.
7. Boarding of the paths in the woods is scheduled for **10.00 on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> September** - **please put this date in your diary**. Sharon will buy tea, milk, coffee, biscuits, etc. and send an email/post on Facebook asking for volunteers. Abi to check that we can use the scout hut.

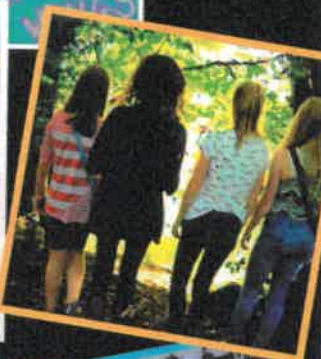
